Support MA Dairy Farmers and the sale of raw milk!

In Massachusetts, consumers have access to safe, healthy, fresh, unpasteurized milk, but only if they go a state-licensed farm to pick it up. **Expanding markets for these farmers would help save dairy farms without the need for government subsidies.**

For that to happen, legislators need to act to support:

- Delivery of unpasteurized milk by the farmer, or their agent, to customers or other farms that sell CSA shares.
- Delivery of pre-purchased unpasteurized milk by an agent of the customer.
- Sale of unpasteurized milk at farmers markets.
- Sale of skim unpasteurized milk, unpasteurized cream and butter made from unpasteurized cream.
- Sale of unpasteurized dairy products on non-contiguous land owned, leased or rented by the producing farmer.
